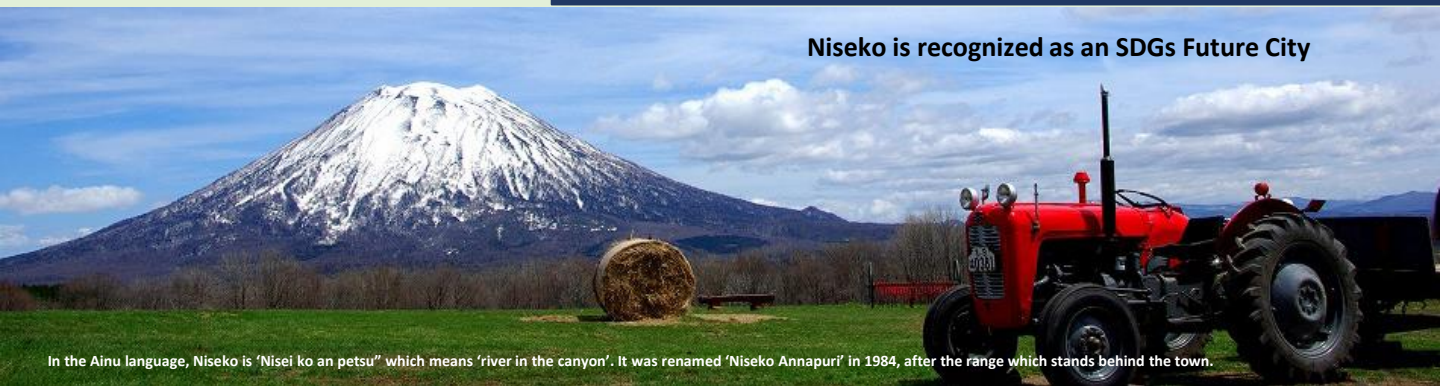

In the Ainu language, Niseko is 'Nisei ko an petsu' which means 'river in the canyon'. It was renamed 'Niseko Annapuri' in 1984, after the range which stands behind the town.



## Purpose of the Event

The world is in the midst of a turbulent era, full of complex social issues, where innovation is necessary. For young people to survive in this new world, with diverse and varied paths, it is necessary to have an 'antenna' to the world, creating a network throughout one's generation, to overcome the pandemonium we face.

To enable the young to prepare to take our world into the future, we must:

- (1) Provide a place for young people with passion, curiosity, uniqueness, and leadership to interact with the world
- (2) Foster a group of experts and prospective leaders in various fields

Through this event, we will strive to create a space that will be an invaluable asset to future Japan, by building a network that brings the youth of the world and Japan together.

## The significance of the choice of Niseko, Hokkaido as the venue

This event will be held in Niseko, Hokkaido. Niseko is a resort area, famous for skiing, which attracts more than 1.6 million visitors annually. The number of foreign tourists has risen dramatically, construction of world class hotels and condominiums has been undertaken, and the town is now one of Japan's leading international resorts.

In Niseko in 2001, the first town development regulations in Japan were put in place. Town development now takes place considering all residents as autonomous, with the scope to think for themselves. In addition, in recognition of the town's efforts for achieving SDGs, the town was recognized by the government as a 'SDG Future City', promoting the construction of 'Sustainable Niseko', and its resulting vibrant, autonomous economy.

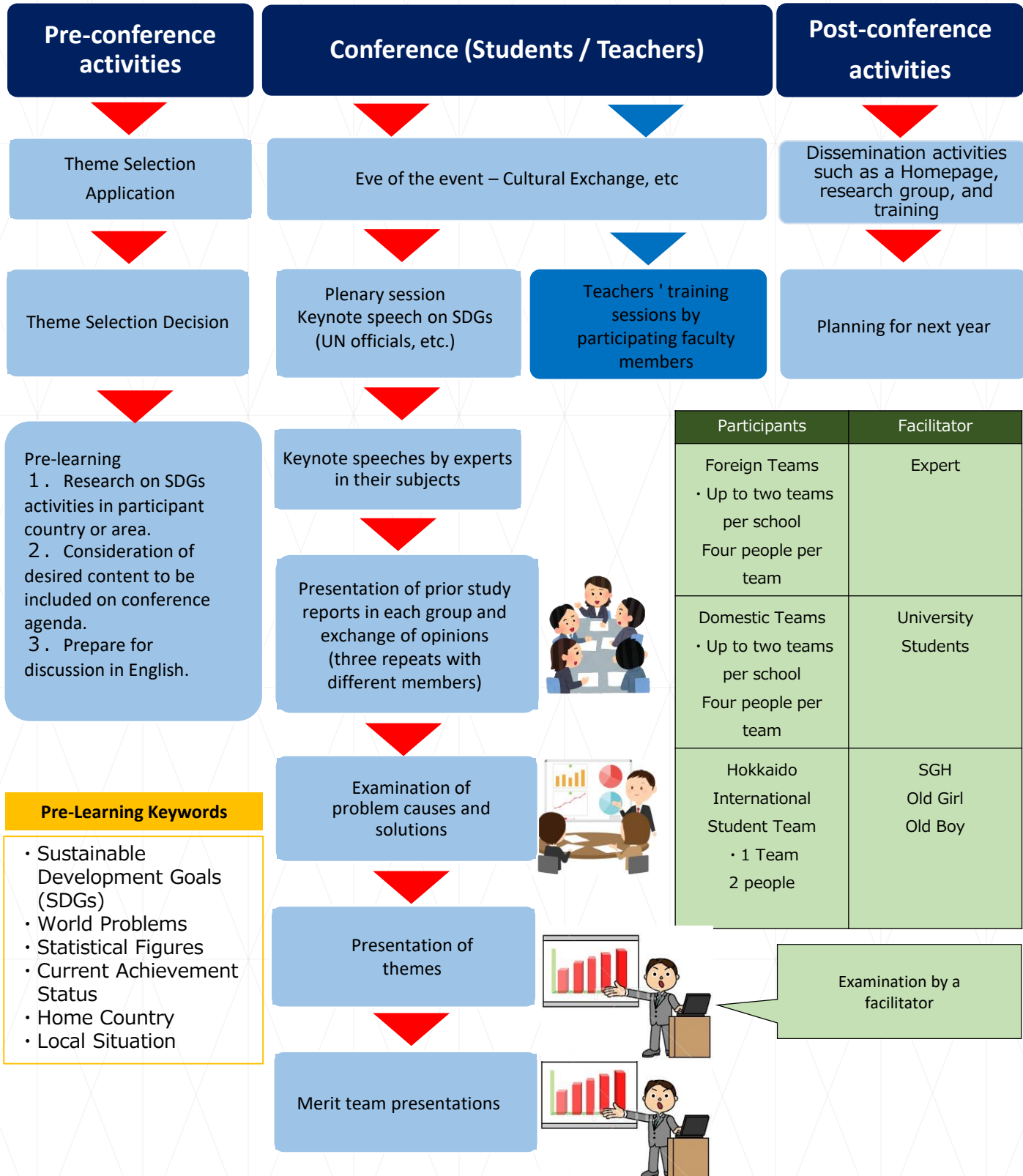
As a beacon of globalization, Niseko was chosen to host the conference, as the town's future focus and international environment will see effective global communication.

## Significance and features of the International Conference for high school students

- (1) High school students from all over Japan, and abroad, come together over three days
- (2) The theme is fostering global awareness of the UN's Sustainable Development Goals
- (3) Broad discussion, and regional diffusion of data by thematic group meetings  
[Pre Learning] → [Group Meeting] → [Proposal Presentation] → [Regional Diffusion]
- (4) Educational support from corporates, international organizations, universities or government observers in group meetings
- (5) Support in meetings from university student SGH alumni
- (6) Youth Development Training held by experts from participating schools, teachers and support organizations. The theme of 'Society 5.0' – an environment which balances economic development and social problem solving, highly integrating the cyber and physical worlds.

## Structure and flow of meetings

The conference will begin with advance activities for participants. There will also be dissemination of information post-conference. Training and induction for participating teachers will be provided.

- ◆ **Participation Fee** : ¥60,000 (tax incl.) per student (includes accommodation, meals, shuttle bus)

### Handling of management account for SDG high school student future meeting donations

The supervision of the sourcing of donations will be conducted by Sapporo Nihon University High School. The management of Sapporo Nihon University High School (Sapporo Japan University Gakuen) has received a special certificate for collecting donations for a specific public interest corporation by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. As this project is not considered part of their main business, individuals and corporations will not be eligible for tax incentives for donations. Consideration will be given any change in tax laws in the future, but please note we cannot offer incentives in 2019. Examples of incentives which are not obtainable are as follows:

#### ◆Individuals

##### Income Tax

Any donations of over ¥2000 will be deductible from pre-tax income for the year the donation was made. Total deductible donations are limited to 40% of income for the year of donation

##### Resident Tax

In addition to the above income tax deduction, a donor's residential tax in their tax municipality will also be reduced, as of January 1<sup>st</sup> the year after any donation was made. Please refer to any municipality directly for further information.

#### ◆Companies

##### Corporate Tax

Donations are given to a specific charitable promotion corporation. Day to day tax deductions, and specific deductions to the project will be recognized separately.
